INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS DAY

On the occasion of International Human Rights Day, the National Human Rights Bureau @ndhr_kw and the United Nations @UNinKuwait celebrated in #Kuwait the signing of a memorandum of understanding, embodying the consolidation of relations and joint action in achieving the goals and aspirations of the State of Kuwait in the field of human rights and its relevant international obligations. The head of the National Bureau for Human Rights, Ambassador Jassem Mubarak Al-Mubaraki, revealed the signing of a memorandum of understanding between the Bureau and the Office of the United Nations in Kuwait, whose side was represented by the representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations and the resident coordinator in the State of Kuwait, Dr. @unhcr_arabic @iomkuwait @unhabitat_gcc @worldfoodprogramme @un_ocha @iloinfo After signing the memorandum of understanding, Ambassador Al-Mubarki said this morning that "this strategic partnership aims to establish a joint cooperation mechanism between the two sides in a way that enhances the role of each and strengthens coordination between them according to the goals and areas of competence of both sides."

For his part, the representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations & Resident Coordinator in the State of Kuwait, Dr. Tariq Al-Sheikh, praised the efforts exerted by the State of Kuwait in the field of developing human rights mechanisms, and that: "Both sides are working together to provide joint support for the implementation of technical and professional programs that achieve the common goals of the two institutions, especially those related to them." Strengthening human rights, developing the capabilities of the civil human rights sector, & spreading human rights awareness among Kuwaiti private sector institutions. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the relevant international conventions and agreements is one of the most prominent positives on which we build our current and future partnership, as it works continuously to adopt many legislations, laws and measures that reflect the extent of their respect for their international obligations in human rights and which encourage us to look forward to more commitments and implementation of the recommendations contained In the periodic reviews of the Human Rights Council, and the work of the State of Kuwait to establish national mechanisms Which contribute to the implementation of those legislation and laws is one of the positive aspects that encouraged the United Nations organizations, programs and funds and the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights to "come together under one UN umbrella through the memorandum of understanding that we sign today on behalf of the United Nations organizations, programs and funds operating in the State of Kuwait."

ECO-CITIES TOWARDS THE ACHIEVEMENT OF KNDP

In Kuwait, focusing on cities is an effective way to pursue environmental sustainability. Currently, the consumptions of water and energy, and the production of waste per capita in Kuwait are among the highest in the world. According to the current projection, the Ministry of Electricity and Water estimates that water demand could increase by 50 per cent between 2015 and 2030.

HEALTH LEADERSHIP FOR POSITIVE CHANGE PROGRAMME ROLLOUT

The programme aims to strengthen the capacities of middle and senior level leaders within Ministry of Health and other sectors in assuming leadership positions in public health. Lessons learned during the COVID19 pandemic and case studies from around the world around burgeoning public health issues are shared in keynote lectures, interactive sessions, and gameplay.



HEALTHY CITY PROGRAMME

A healthy city is an urban area which maintains and improves the social and natural environment and enables people to support each other through developing their potential to promote health. The goal of the WHO healthy city programme is to improve the health and quality of life of city dwellers on continuous bases through sustained community participation and intersectoral collaboration.

Since the establishment of Kuwait's Healthy Cities Office (HCO) at the Ministry of Health in 2014, a number of milestones propelled the growth of the Programme in Kuwait, such as the registration of 12 additional cities in Kuwait to the Regional Healthy Cities Network, the awarding of Al Yarmouk in 2019 as Kuwait's first Healthy City and the embedment of the Healthy Cities Programme in Kuwait's Third National Development Plan (2015 – 2020).

In the past year 2021, WHO conducted the following activities in collaboration with the Healthy Cities Office at the Kuwait Ministry of Health:

KUWAIT'S FIRST VIRTUAL CAPACITY-BUILDING WORKSHOP FOR HEALTHY CITIES

The workshop consisted of 14 training hours attended by 120 participants, and it is an accredited component of the Continuing Education Program at the Kuwait Institute for Medical Specialization. The workshop targeted workers in Kuwait's healthcare sector. The main goal was to advance implementation standards pertinent to Healthy Cities.





TRAINING ON HEALTHY CITIES PROGRAMME EVALUATION TOOLS & METHODOLOGIES

- This exercise consisted of a simulated evaluation wherein Healthy Cities Program (HCP) focal persons engaged in a consultative process with WHO EMRO Healthy Cities evaluators to determine the readiness of both cities for external evaluation.
- The 3-day training programme was deployed in the cities of Abdullah Al-Salem and Al-Shamiyah from the 21^{st} 23^{rd} of December 2021.
- The exercise yielded a number of insights, challenges, and recommendations ahead of the external evaluation for both cities.

IOM KUWAIT, THE EMBASSY OF SRI LANKA, AND OOREDOO TELECOM CELEBRATE THE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY THROUGH ARTS

To mark International Women's Day, the International Organization for Migration (IOM), UN Migration agency in Kuwait, brought together women from different walks of life and organized an art event that allowed them to express themselves through painting, while socializing with others.

The event came in coordination with the Embassy of Sri Lanka in Kuwait and took place at its premises, and was in partnership with Ooredoo telecom, the first to introduce innovative digital services in Kuwait, through a joint agreement signed in November 2020, under the My Ooredoo application. The application allows customers and members of the 'Nojoom' program to donate their points to IOM to support community cohesion activities and support migrant workers.

"It is critical to recognize that women, including migrant women, are also powerful agents and leaders in their families and communities, and at national and international levels, providing resources for their families, facilitating migration, and adapting during displacement." said Mazen AboulHosn, IOM Kuwait Chief of Mission "Utilizing the contributions and ensuring the participation of all genders is key to addressing climate change and disaster impacts and ensuring that any solutions build on the capabilities, knowledge and perspectives of women. It is essential also to share mutual benefits between genders and empower women to be active agents in mitigating climate change and pursuing adaptation responses ".

"Expression through arts is an activity that is educational, social and cultural. Art-based activity can have a positive effect on several aspects of the being. We are glad to organize this activity with the Sri Lankan embassy through the Nojoom program of Ooredoo.


