Ms. Ghada ElTahir has more than 25 years of experience in humanitarian and development affairs. Prior to her current appointment, she served on different positions at the UN Office of Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs UN OCHA in New York, notably as Deputy Director of the Operations and Advocacy Division, where she was also Acting Director March to August 2022. She has also served as Chief of Eastern and Southern Africa and as Acting Deputy Director for Middle East and North Africa, overseeing OCHA activities in those regions.

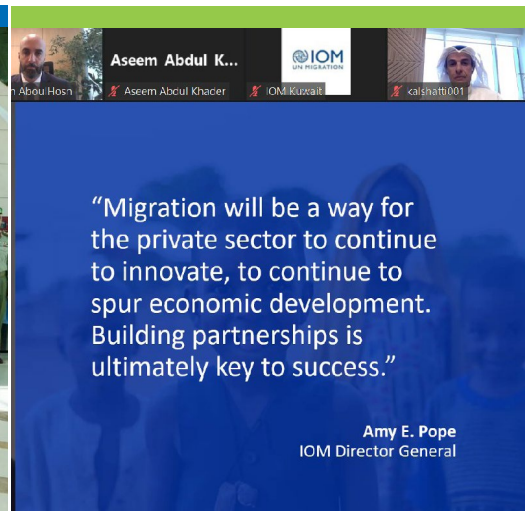
## 5<sup>TH</sup> BATCH OF PWD EMPLOYMENT CAMPAIGN

## THE SECOND VOLUNTARY NATIONAL REVIEW IN KUWAIT (VNR2)

KUNA: The General Secretariat of the Supreme Council for Planning and Development held a consultative and preparatory meeting on Thursday morning with the United Nations team for the State of Kuwait's participation in the Sustainable Development Goals Summit.

The Secretary-General of the Supreme Council for Planning and Development, Dr. Khaled Mahdi, said in a press statement on the sidelines of the coordination meeting that the meeting will discuss and review the achievements made by the offices of international organizations in the State of Kuwait regarding the goals of sustainable development in cooperation with various state agencies.

Dr. Mahdi indicated that the State of Kuwait will participate in the summit on sustainable development goals, which will discuss global developments and future strategic challenges related to the 17 sustainable development goals, measure global strategies, stimulate international cooperation, and accelerate actions to confront pressing global issues.

He explained that the meeting witnessed the participation of representatives from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, heads of United Nations organizations in the State of Kuwait, and the technical team of the General Secretariat of the Supreme Council for Planning and Development, indicating that the heads of non-resident United Nations organizations participated virtually in the meeting.

Dr. Mahdi added that there is structural and substantive integration between the sustainable development goals and the vision of the State of Kuwait 2035, explaining that this

integration made its organization, implementation, coordination and monitoring of the various goals and indicators achievable in addition to being comprehensive and effective.

He stressed that the State of Kuwait renews its firm commitment to the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals agenda and continues its commitment to promoting this agenda as a social goal and a public issue, indicating that the State of Kuwait views these goals as a priority for public policy making.

Dr. Mahdi explained that in July of this year, the State of Kuwait submitted the second voluntary report, which focuses on the national plan and its harmony with the sustainable development goals, the pioneering role played by the State of Kuwait in dealing with the Corona pandemic, and international cooperation with global organizations, especially the World Health Organization.

He said that in the second voluntary report, the State of Kuwait adopted a comprehensive national approach with the aim of enabling all national actors and stakeholders at the public and private sector levels, as well as the academic level and civil society, to participate in the review process and announce their achievements and ongoing programs, describing the second voluntary national review as a national review that belongs to all.

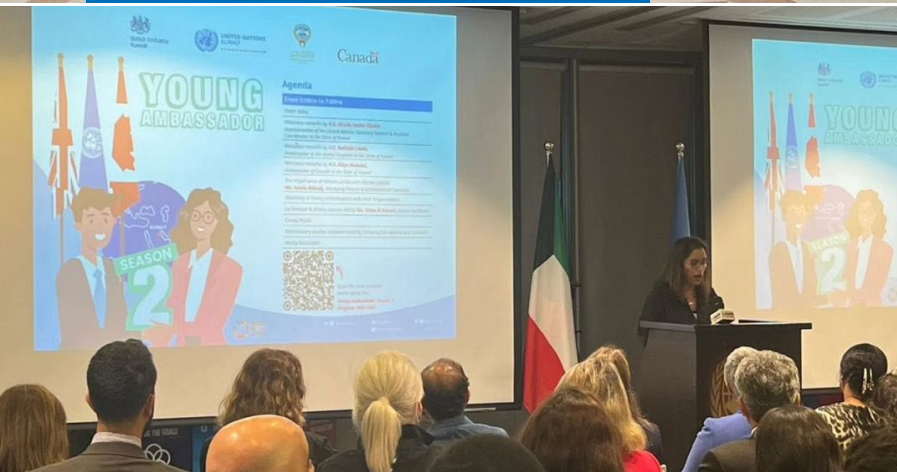

The prestigious Kuwait State Prize for Combating Cancer, Cardiovascular Diseases and Diabetes in the Eastern Mediterranean Region, administered by the World Health Organization, was awarded to three distinguished researchers yesterday. This award, established in 2003 with support from Kuwait, recognizes exemplary contributions in these health fields.

Dr. Arif Al Nouryani from the United Arab Emirate:

Recognized for his work in the field of cardiovascular diseases, Dr. Al Nouryani, a German board-certified cardiologist, has headed Al Qasimi Hospital in Sharjah since 2009, where he has introduced more than 50 innovative medical technologies.

Dr. Randa Rabhi Hamada from Bahrain:

In honor of her leadership in cancer research, Dr. Randa is a professor of community medicine at the Arabian Gulf University. She is also a staunch advocate for combating smoking, and topped the list of the top 2% of scientists in the world.

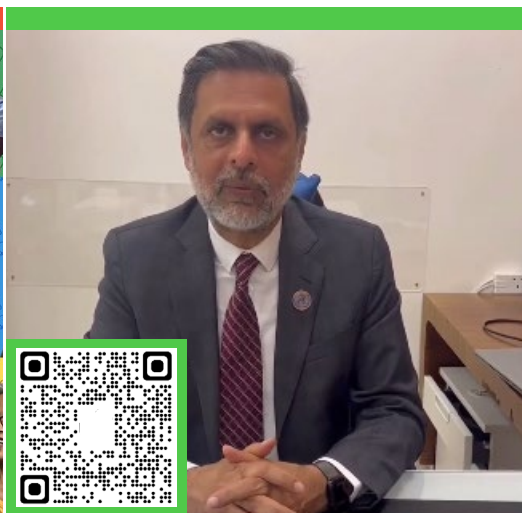
Dr. Afshin Astwar from the Islamic Republic of Iran:

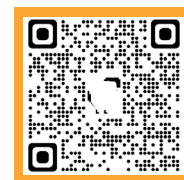
## MINES AND THEIR REPERCUSSIONS ON THE ENVIRONMENT

Under the patronage of His Excellency the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sheikh Salem Abdullah Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, the Kuwait Oil Company hosted the International Day for the Prevention of the Use of the Environment in Wars and Military Conflicts, which was organized by the Kuwait Society for Environmental Protection under the slogan "Mines and their Repercussions on the Environment." It was attended by a number of company officials, led by the Director of the Relations Group. Public and media Muhammad Al-Basri.

The event, which was held at the Ahmed Al Jaber Oil and Gas Exhibition, began with a speech by the sponsor of the occasion, His Excellency the Minister of Foreign Affairs, delivered on his behalf by Minister Plenipotentiary Abdulaziz Al-Jarallah, in which he indicated that celebrating this day is an annual reminder of the international community's commitment to protecting the environment as a basic pillar of peace and sustainable development.

Al-Jarallah stressed that the State of Kuwait suffered from the use of the environment as a tool of war after the burning of oil wells ignited by the forces of the former Iraqi regime before their withdrawal from Kuwaiti territory in 1991, which caused one of the worst man-made environmental disasters in the twentieth century. Therefore, the State of Kuwait You are fully aware of the risks of these violations.

For her part, the President of the Association, Dr. Wijdan Al-Oqab, in her speech in the role of the Kuwait Oil Company as the association's strategic partner, in the November 6 event held annually, stressing that Kuwait has incurred and continues to incur huge amounts of money in order to cleanse the country of mines and the remnants of the Iraqi aggression in 1990, pointing out that history records that the highest number of mines planted Per square kilometer were detected in Kuwait, amounting to 92 mines. The event also witnessed the honoring of participants and sponsors, the awarding of the Environmental Champions Medal, in addition to a tour of the exhibition held on the sidelines of the event.





## ENERGY-FOOD-WATER NEXUS, SPOTLIGHTING THE ARAB STATES

Tawfeek Al Sharjabi, Minister of Water and Environment – Yemen, discussed key challenges and unveiled 'The Impact of Climate Change on Human Development in Yemen' report.

The session's outcomes: a holistic Nexus approach understanding, global awareness boost, collaborative frameworks, and actionable recommendations for resilient societies. A crucial step toward sustainable development and peace in crisis-affected areas.

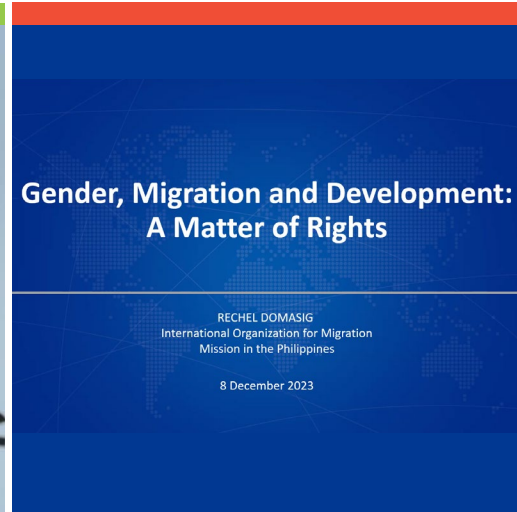
## RESIDENT COORDINATORS GLOBAL MEETING

## UNICEF ANNOUNCES THE IMPLEMENTATION OF 'BACK TO SCHOOL' ACTIVITIES IN YEMEN

Shaikh Abdullah Al Nouri Charity Society and UNICEF Gulf concluded "Back the first fundraising campaign for UNICEF in Kuwait early this year, to support children in Yemen. UNICEF announced recently the start of the implementation phase of this campaign to improve children's access to equitable education and learning opportunities, after eight years of war that left many in poverty and out of school, through the provision of basic education services, rehabilitating damaged schools, provision of school bags and stationery as well as building the capacity of teachers and facilitators for effective delivery of basic education.

## MIGRATION, DEVELOPMENT, & GENDER

IOM Kuwait in coordination with IOM Philippines and in partnership with the Philippines Embassy organized a webinar on "Migration, Development, and Gender". The webinar, which took place on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December with the participation of members of the Philippines community in Kuwait, aimed to mark the UN global initiative of the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence and shed light on some of the issues related to migration, gender & linkage to development.



## KUWAIT CONTRIBUTES TO UNICEF'S EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO CHILDREN IMPACTED BY THE EARTHQUAKES IN TÜRKIYE AND SYRIA

The State of Kuwait has contributed US\$17 million in humanitarian funding towards UNICEF support for delivering essential education, nutrition, water, sanitation, and hygiene services and supplies to earthquake-affected children and families in Türkiye and Syria.

Millions of children in Türkiye and Syria have been affected by the deadly earthquakes that struck in February 2023. The situation remains dire for them. In Syria, the water and sewage infrastructure was severely damaged putting 6.5 million people at elevated risk of waterborne diseases, including cholera.

An estimated 51,000 children under the age of five are likely to suffer from wasting. Thousands of schools were impacted and 1.9 million children have had their education disrupted, with many schools still being used as shelters.



## INTERLINKAGES BETWEEN CLIMATE CHANGE, MIGRATION & HEALTH & THEIR IMPACTS ON HOST SOCIETIES & TEMPORARY CONTRACTUAL WORKERS IN THE GULF

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) under the auspices of H.E. Sheikh H.E. Sheikh Salem Abdullah Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the State of Kuwait, hosted a two-day workshop on the interlinkages between climate change, migration and health, and their impacts on host communities and temporary contractual workers in the Gulf countries.

The workshop aimed to provide a platform for participants to deepen understanding of the health impacts of climate change both for host communities and temporary contractual workers in the sub-region, to exchange initiatives and good practices of the measures to respond to vulnerabilities arising from climate-induced occupational health risks on these groups, as well as to identify key areas of intervention and action in the lead-up to COP 28.



## INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS DAY (IMD)

IOM Kuwait marked the International Migrants Day in Kuwait, in coordination with the Integrated Community Center (ICC). Participants engaged in activities that enabled them to talk about their experiences, discuss challenges as well as future prospects and opportunities.

The event, which was organized and funded through private sector donations, aimed to honour the migrant workers' resiliency, contributions and embrace their social and cultural diversities.

WFP welcomed today's opening of the border crossing between Egypt and Gaza, which enabled a first convoy of trucks to bring in urgently needed food, water and other supplies provided by the Egyptian Red Crescent and the United Nations for hundreds of thousands of Palestinians.

## WFP CALLS FOR SUSTAINED ACCESS TO GAZA AS HUMANITARIAN CONVOY BRINGS FIRST FOOD SUPPLIES ACROSS BORDER

Cindy McCain, the Executive Director of WFP, emphasized the urgent need for continuous and safe access for humanitarian aid in Gaza, stressing that while this initial convoy was a crucial step, more aid convoys were necessary to address the catastrophic conditions in southern Gaza. WFP had additional emergency food stocks of 930 metric tons awaiting access into Gaza to replenish rapidly depleting supplies.

Since the start of the crisis, some 520,000 people have received WFP food assistance. WFP is expanding its operation to support 1.1 million people in Gaza in the next two months.

Assistance includes fresh bread delivered daily to Gazans in UN shelters in areas where access is allowed. WFP supplies flour to contracted bakeries, which produce bread for distribution. However, in recent days many bakeries have stopped working because of lack of power and fuel.
