
THEME



3 WORKSHOPS WITH YOUTH GROUPS SATURDAY 23 OCTOBER

Session 1: Renewable Energy

The Session on Renewable Energy started at 2:30 pm with experience sharing from the first youth presenter who introduced awareness rising initiative on Kuwait public transportation system and traffic situation to be safe, convenient and efficient, ecofriendly and inclusive. This initiative will be promoted in three phases: problem identification and survey (Phase I); situation analysis and pilot project design (Phase II); and implementation with partners (Phase III). Currently, the initiative is on the phase between the first and the second. The presenter then emphasized the importance of partnership with government authorities, including Kuwait Municipality, Authority for Roads and Land Transport, Ministry of Interior and Public Authority for Agriculture Affairs and Fish Resources.

The second youth presenter primarily focused on renewable energy and its research process (i.e., challenges, experiential testing, modelling approach and empirical findings) in the context of Kuwait. The presenter particularly stressed greater potential of solar energy to be mainstreamed into national energy mix, which would contribute to transformative shift into environmental sustainability.

The third presenter (Cynthia Khoury from UNIC) made a brief introduction on the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and its inter-dynamics of the three dimensions of sustainable development, including economic, social and environmental. The presenter ended it by showing the UN's commitment, including communication campaigns, website, video clips, song and among others.

3 WORKSHOPS WITH YOUTH GROUPS SATURDAY 23 OCTOBER

Session 2: Biodiversity

Matrah A. Al-Mutairi from Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research delivered a presentation on "Fauna of Kuwait: Threats of Biodiversity". The presenter provided some background on the native fauna of Kuwait and the wildlife species. The presentation highlighted that over the last few decades, the desert of Kuwait has, unfortunately, witnessed local extinctions of the significant species. Status of recorded Mammals in Kuwait within 100 years illustrates that 41% of mammals are extinct and 9 per cent are threatened with extinction. The presenter highlighted that the effects of climate change on biodiversity are increasingly well documented, and many methods have been developed to assess species' vulnerability to climatic changes, both ongoing and projected in the coming decades. To minimize global biodiversity losses, conservationists need to identify those species that are likely to be most vulnerable to the impacts of climate change.

Mohammed Al-Sayegh delivered a presentation on the effect of climate change and human activity on the burrows of Uromastyx aegyptia in Kuwait. He divided the causes of biodiversity loss into two main categories: Human Activity, and Climate Change. In their study, to better understand the effect and design an effective management plan, they have decided to use drone and satellite imagery technology. By looking at burrows density and distribution over time, they can analyse whether the dhubs are increasing or decreasing and why. The ground and drone surveys were used for data collection. The expected outcomes of the study include: decline in dhub burrows, significant effect of climate change on density and distribution, and significant effect of human activity on density and distribution. The presenter recommended that urgent management plan

must be implemented to maintain and restore biodiversity status.

Abdulaziz Mohammad Alateegi talked about the steps towered more sustainable dairy farming in Kuwait. He provided a brief history on the nation's use of dairy products and consumption, and its economy based on trade and imports of goods and how oil production and the modernity of Kuwait City transformed dairy production from a non-profit system to a professional model, with a profit nature that affects the gross national product. He presented the KDFE's mission including increase in milk production (Lifetime Daily Yield), while using less resources, to reduce the environmental footprint. KDFE is using digitalization methods to collect livestock data which will feed into the real time dashboards to precision dairy farming management. He closed his presentation by this quote:

"At the end sustainable dairy farming is about love, passion and require continues education"

3 WORKSHOPS WITH YOUTH GROUPS SATURDAY 23 OCTOBER

Session 3: Waste Management

The session started with a presentation by Dr. Dhari Al-Howail, from Kuwait Divers, to remove waste from the sea and ocean, he explained that their intervention comes in 3 sectors, awareness, protection and rescue and rehabilitation. They have been working for 29 years removing 15 thousand tons of waste from the sea. 3.7K of that waste is plastic. 250 plus of this waste is fishing nets, 11K vessels, their partnership is UNFPA working on protecting the environment. The group pf divers saved 2 sea turtles 35 Kg and the second one is 53 Kg and were kept at the scientific center for rehabilitation and release again.

The second presentation was by Hamad Al-Kulaib, he has been working in recycling for the past 10 years, raising awareness and after many years of working in the sector, they have been facing a lot of challenges and the recycling companies are shutting down. SDG 11 needs to be focused on by everyone and as advocators of it, the production needs to equal consumption which companies need to focus on. He explained, that production need to put a praise tag of the their environmental products as a fee.



The 3rd presentation was given by Cynthia Khouri, on the SDGs, their importance and a brief idea about them, the implementation of the goals started in 2015 and 9 years to go and achieve them. all countries need to mobilize their resources to achieve the goals for sustainable development.

She promoted the implementation of the SDGs for individuals and stressed that it is not necessary that we wait for state members to do it for us, each one is responsible for implementing the SDGs

In the end she presented success stories from Lebanon through a short video.






