When women are economically secure, they invest in their families and communities, spurring economic growth and creating more stable societies. Also, Women's equal participation at every level lead to better financial performance and raises returns on investment. The private sector has an important role to play to support and promote gender equality by investing in the economic empowerment of women in their workplaces and communities.

The private sector in Kuwait has been leading and advancing in this area, where more than 40 companies in Kuwait have committed to the Women's Empowerment Principles (WEPs). Globally, there are more than 7000 companies CEOs who signed up the #WEPs www.weps.org. WEP promotes empowerment of women and gender equality in various areas such as high-level corporate leadership; employees' health and wellbeing; training for career advancement; enterprise development; nodiscrimination at workplace; community initiatives and measurement/reporting.

Leading members of the Kuwait private sector launched the Women's Economic Empowerment Platform Kuwait (WEEP Kuwait) on 6 June 2022, with a vision to foster a private sector that is gender-inclusive, and which will contribute to implementation of Agenda 2030 and the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 5 and Kuwait's national development priorities on growth and social protection.







INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

HOW TO FACILITATE THE MOVEMENT OF EXPATRIATE LABOR WITHIN THE KUWAITI LABOR MARKET

In cooperation with the ILO and the International Organization of Employers, the Kuwait Chamber of Commerce and Industry held a meeting on facilitating the movement of expatriate labor within the Kuwaiti labor market. The meeting was attended by experts of the two organizations, representatives of sectoral unions and a number of Kuwaiti companies from various sectors. This meeting comes to complete the efforts made by the Chamber with the ILO to extrapolate the challenges facing the Kuwaiti labor market, which were revealed by the Covid pandemic, and the current and future needs of this market. On the other hand, they discussed social protection for expatriate workers in Kuwait, and companies generally expressed that this protection is guaranteed by Law No. 6 of 2010 regarding work in the private sector, which protects the worker through many means, including the obligation to set a minimum wage and approve it for a period of time. Three months to notify the worker before the termination of his services, in addition to the end-of-service gratuity and the clear keenness of the Public Authority for Manpower and Kuwaiti banks to transfer salaries to the workers on the scheduled dates. Representatives of small and medium enterprises touched on the difficulties they faced regarding end-of-service benefits in light of the pandemic, as the pandemic and the accompanying measures stopped that and with the financial flows of many of these projects that were taking their first steps in the world of self-employment.

FIFTH UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON THE LEAST DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

The representative of His Highness Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, Emir of the State of Kuwait, may God protect and preserve him, His Excellency Sheikh Salem Abdullah Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, Minister of Foreign Affairs, headed the delegation of the State of Kuwait participating in the work of the Fifth United Nations Conference on the Least Developed Countries (Part Two), held during The period from 5 to 9 March 2023 in the capital of the sister state of Qatar, Doha.

The conference's proceedings dealt with a number of main issues related to the implementation of new development business strategies to achieve the aspiration of the world's least developed countries and to enhance their role in the international community, and to discuss areas for providing aid to the 46 least developed countries, supporting their sustainable economic foundations, and enabling them to raise their productive capacities and qualify them for integration into the global economy. And assisting them in overcoming the negative repercussions left by the Covid-19 pandemic, and facing the repercussions of the current conflicts and wars, in addition to helping these countries to overcome their difficult conditions and examining weaknesses in the face of not achieving sustainable development in them, and strengthening intrainternational trade, and supporting joint international efforts to confront the effects. The negative consequences of climate change and environmental degradation, building capacities to face future challenges, and mobilizing synergies and international partnerships to support the graduation of countries from the category of least developed countries.

During the conference, all concerned governments and international organizations were invited to cooperate and exchange advanced technological expertise to enhance the sectors of food security, health care, and human resource development, harness science, technology and innovation in this context, and support digital and structural transformation as main drivers for achieving the desired prosperity and progress. It should be noted that the Fifth United Nations Conference on the Least Developed Countries is held every decade, and is considered one of the largest gatherings of world leaders in 2023.
